Costs of municipally-owned highways

Resolution 24-51: Joyce Malenfant – Réginald Manning

WHEREAS the Province of Ontario has agreed to assume responsibility for the Gardiner Expressway and the Don Valley Parkway from the City of Toronto, which will be uploaded to the Province;

AND WHEREAS like the City of Toronto, all municipalities in the Province of Ontario are experiencing significant financial and budgetary pressures, including those related to infrastructure development, maintenance and repairs, and are seeking reasonable solutions to address the same while balancing their financial books;

AND WHEREAS the uploading of municipal highway infrastructure to the Province of Ontario or, alternatively, appropriately increasing the Ontario Community Infrastructure Fund to Ontario municipalities will assist municipalities in addressing such financial challenges;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT Council for the Municipality of Mattice – Val Côté hereby support the motion made by Council for the County of Lambton on February 7<sup>th</sup>, 2024 and request that the Province of Ontario upload from local municipalities the responsibility of and costs associated with the continued construction, operation and maintenance of major municipally-owned highways throughout the Province of Ontario to the Ontario Ministry of Transportation or, alternatively, if uploading is not the preferred option of the Province and/or local municipality, to appropriately increase the Ontario Community Infrastructure Fund to municipalities so as to fairly and equitably allocate resources to Ontario municipalities;

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the County of Lambton and to our local parliament representatives, MPP Guy Bourgouin and MP Carol Hughes.

Redirect funding for proposed Highway 413

Resolution 24-52: Joyce Malenfant – Steve Brousseau

WHEREAS the Municipality of Mattice – Val Côté recognizes the importance for efficient and effective transportation networks in the Province, and;

WHEREAS the Province has committed to getting 1.5 million homes built within the next 10 years or less.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT Council for the Municipality of Mattice – Val Côté hereby support the resolution made by the Township of Amaranth on February 21<sup>st</sup>, 2024, requesting that the Province of Ontario pause advancement on proposed highway 413 and redirect the approximate \$8 billion cost for highway 413 to support municipal infrastructure costs and housing construction initiatives, and;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT at least 50% of those funds be allocated for small urban and rural Ontario with populations less than 50,000 and;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Township of Amaranth and to our local parliament representatives, MPP Guy Bourgouin and MP Carol Hughes.

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Operational funding

Resolution 24-53: Steve Brousseau – Joyce Malenfant

WHEREAS all Ontario municipalities are prohibited from running budget deficits for operations purposes, and;

WHEREAS all Ontario municipalities have similar pressures with respect to aging infrastructure and operating costs for policing, and:

WHEREAS the City of Toronto has recently received provincial funding to cover a \$1.2 billion dollar operating shortfall and approximately \$12 million in federal and provincial funding for their police operating budget, and;

WHEREAS the City of Toronto has the lowest tax rates in the Province, approximately 40% less than the average Dufferin rural municipal tax rate;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT Council for the Municipality of Mattice – Val Côté hereby support Resolution no. 4 made by Council for the Township of Amaranth on March 6<sup>th</sup>, 2024, calling on the Province of Ontario to treat all municipalities fairly and provide equivalent representative operational budget funding amounts to all Ontario municipalities, and;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Township of Amaranth and to our local parliament representatives, MPP Guy Bourgouin and MP Carol Hughes.

Use of the Public Works garage

Resolution 24-54: Sophie Gagnon – Réginald Manning BE IT RESOLVED THAT Council for the Municipality of Mattice – Val Côté hereby revokes Resolution 21-35 and replaces it with the following;

- Council for the Municipality of Mattice Val Côté allows the local snowmobile club, the Mattice Sno Devils, to use the Public Works garage, in the presence of a municipal employee, to occasionally perform maintenance and repairs on the groomer and drag, and;
- An hourly fee of SIXTY (\$60.00) DOLLARS will be charged to the Northern Corridor du Nord Snowmobile Association for the hours of work so performed in the Public Works garage, said fee to include the occasional use of tools and of basic shop supplies, and;

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 It is understood that, should the use of tools or of basic shop supplies result in expenses of THIRTY or more (\$30.00+) DOLLARS, said expenses will also be charged to the Corridor, and;

4. Should a municipal employee be called upon to assist club volunteers to perform maintenance or mechanical work during his normal working hours, an additional hourly labour fee will be charged to the Corridor, payable in accordance with Resolution 22-124.
