Recyclables from non-eligible sources	 Resolution 25-21: Joyce Malenfant – Steve Brousseau WHEREAS under Regulation 391/21: Blue Box, producers are fully accountable and financially responsible for their products and packaging once they reach their end of life and are disposed of, for "eligible" sources only, and; WHEREAS "ineligible" sources, which producers are not responsible for, include businesses, places of worship, daycares, campgrounds, public-facing and internal areas of municipal-owned buildings and not-for-profit organizations, such as shelters and food banks, and; WHEREAS should a municipality continue to provide services to the "ineligible" sources, the municipality will be required to oversee the collection, transportation and processing of the recycling, assuming 100% of the costs, and; WHEREAS these costs will further burden the municipalities' finances and potentially take resources away from vital infrastructure projects; NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT Council of the Municipality of Mattice – Val Côté hereby requests that the province amend Ontario Regulation 391/21: Blue Box so that producers are responsible for the end-of-life management of recycling products from all sources, and; BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Honourable Andrea Khanjin, Minister of the Environment, Conservation and Parks, to AMO, ROMA and FONOM and to our local parliament representatives, MP Carol Hughes and MPP Guy Bourgouit.
