Road safety Resolution 24-27: Sophie Gagnon – Marc Dupuis

> BE IT RESOLVED THAT Council for the Municipality of Mattice -Val Côté support Resolution #4-1-2024 made by Council for the Town of Mono, calling on other municipalities and on the Province of Ontario to recognize a Road Safety Emergency and on the Province to take the following actions:

> 1. Launch a province-wide road safety educational program, to be funded from a portion of the monies currently spent by the Ontario Lottery and Gaming Corporation (OLG) to advertise games of chance and lotteries in Ontario;

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 Review and increase all Highway Traffic Act (HTA) fines and penalties to reflect a deterrent amount and consequences that sends a message that driving is a privilege subject to conditions;

- Permit municipalities to deploy Automated Speed Enforcement (ASE) in 80 km/h zones or less without having to declare Community Safety Zones and without onerous conditions;
- Establish a Working Group with municipalities to identify and recommend elimination of regulatory red tape associated with the use of ASE and Administrative Monetary Penalties (AMPs);
- Develop mechanisms that ensure Provincial Offenses Act (POA) fines and penalties do not lose their deterrent effect over time;
- 6. Work with municipalities to create better means of collecting outstanding POA fines and Victim Surcharge monies, estimated to exceed \$1 billion as far back as 2011;

Replacement of fire trucks

Resolution 24-28: Marc Dupuis – Sophie Gagnon

WHEREAS no provincial funding is available for new fire trucks, yet small and rural municipalities must meet the same standards set by Fire Underwriters Survey (FUS) as larger municipalities for fire equipment, including additional pressure to move fire trucks out when they reach a specific age, even though they can still meet the safety regulations;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT Council for the Municipality of Mattice – Val Côté support Resolution No. 2024-46 made by Council for the County of Prince Edward, requesting a meeting with Minister Todd Smith to discuss the life span of fire apparatus, specifically pertaining to the replacement of fire trucks due to insurance requirements, and requesting that the FUS create a new community fire protection and fire prevention insurance system that does not put all municipalities under the same umbrella, with distinct categories for rural and urban municipalities, and;

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT Premier Doug Ford, David Piccini, Minister of Labour, Immigration, Training and Skills Development, and Paul Calandra, Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing, respond to this matter within 30 days of receipt of the County's resolution, and;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the County of Prince Edward and to our local parliament representatives, MPP Guy Bourgouin and MP Carol Hughes.

National strategy of firefighting

Resolution 24-29: Marc Dupuis - Sophie Gagnon

WHEREAS forest fires are a very real threat to rural municipalities, and;

WHEREAS smoke from forest fires put people's health at risk, especially the health of children and the elderly, and;

WHEREAS, according to John Grace, a retired scientist with Natural Resources Canada, around two billion tonnes of carbon have been released into the atmosphere from forest fires in 2023, and;

WHEREAS standing healthy forests serves as carbon sinks, drawing in carbon, but once destroyed by fire, even though second growth takes place, they are much less effective for many decades, and;

WHEREAS the federal government owns no water bombers and assists the provinces through the Canadian Interagency Forest Fire Centre (CIFFC) and;

WHEREAS a spokesperson with the CIFFC said that last year there were too many requests and not enough inventory to meet the needs of the country;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT Council for the Municipality of Mattice – Val Côté support Resolution 2024-31 made by Council for the Municipality of Calvin, urging and encouraging the Federal Government to commit additional funds for cost sharing of provincial firefighting and to consider the development of a national strategy of firefighting and;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Federal Government consider the measures necessary for acquiring a national fleet of Canadian-made waterbombers, with home bases strategically located to best serve and respond to the needs of rural

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communities, and a national fire administration to better coordinate and manage efforts across the country, and;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT a program similar to the Joint Emergency Preparedness Program (JEPP), which was ended in 2013, be introduced, and;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Municipality of Calvin and to our local parliament representatives, MPP Guy Bourgouin and MP Carol Hughes.
