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Shortage of physicians

Resolution 22-153: Richard Lemay – Daniel Grenier

WHEREAS the Province of Ontario and particularly rural areas are experiencing a severe shortage of physicians, leaving many people without access to medical care;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT Council for the Municipality of Mattice – Val Côté hereby supports Motion R-266-2020 made by Council for the Town of South Bruce Peninsula requesting that the Province of Ontario and the Government of Canada recognize the shortage of physicians, including specialists and general practitioners, and;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT, in order to support Ontario municipalities and their residents, the provincial and federal governments take steps to provide support and subsidy to students entering medical school with the intention of becoming practicing physicians in the province of Ontario, particularly in underserviced rural and northern municipalities, and;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the provincial and federal governments work with Canadian universities to increase the number of students accepted into medical school and residency programs, and;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Province expedite the accreditation process for foreign medical practitioners, and;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Municipality of Mattice – Val Côté supports whatever protective measures the provincial and federal governments place on the subsidy given, to ensure that the students receiving funding become practicing physicians in the province of Ontario, and;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Town of South Bruce Peninsula and to our local federal and provincial parliament representatives, MP Carol Hugues and MPP Guy Bourgouin.

Locate delays <u>Resolution 22-154</u>: Joyce Malenfant – Daniel Grenier

WHEREAS Council for the Municipality of Mattice – Val Côté received a copy of letters pertaining to locate delays from the Township of Black River – Matheson dated July 18th, 2022 and addressed to GTel, from the Town of Kapuskasing dated July 19th, 2022 and addressed to FONOM and from the Township of Fauquier – Strickland dated August 9th, 2022 and addressed to FONOM, and;
