	OPP costs to Province	Resolution 24-157: Joyce Malenfant – Marc Dupuis WHEREAS it is apparent that the Ontario Government has overlooked the needs of small rural Ontario, and; WHEREAS Ontario's small rural municipalities face insurmountable challenges to fund both upfront investments and ongoing maintenance of their capital assets, including roads, bridges, water/wastewater and municipally owned buildings, including recreational facilities, libraries and other tangible capital assets, and; WHEREAS small rural Ontario's operating needs consume the majority of property tax revenue sources, and; WHEREAS small rural municipalities (of 10,000 people or less) are facing monumental infrastructure deficits that cannot be adequately addressed through property tax revenue alone, and; WHEREAS the Ontario Government has committed \$9.1 billion to Toronto alone to assist with operating deficits and the repatriation of the Don Valley and Gardiner Expressway and \$534 million to Ottawa for the repatriation of Hwy 174, and; WHEREAS the annual cost of the Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) and of the Municipal Policing Bureau for small rural non- contract (5.1) municipalities is approximately \$428 million, and; WHEREAS this annual OPP cost is significantly less than the repatriation costs of the Gardiner Express Way, the Don Valley Expressway and Highway 174 (Ottawa Region) but provides a greater impact to the residents of the Province overall, and; WHEREAS the repatriation by the Province of the OPP costs will afford relief to small rural municipalities for both infrastructure and operating needs, while having a minimal impact on the provincial budget;	

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT Council for the Municipality of Mattice – Val Côté hereby supports Resolution no. 207-2024 made by Council for the Township of Terrace Bay, calling upon the Ontario Government to immediately implement sustainable funding for small rural municipalities by reabsorbing the cost of the OPP back into the provincial budget with no cost recovery to municipalities, and; BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Township of Terrace Bay, the Municipality of Tweed, Premier Doug Ford, the Minister of Solicitor General, the Minister of Finance and to our local parliament representatives, MPP Guy Bourgouin and MP Carol Hughes.

Health care system crisis

<u>Resolution 24-158</u>: Sophie Gagnon – Joyce Malenfant WHEREAS the state of health care in Ontario is in crisis, with

2.3 million Ontarians lacking access to a family doctor, emergency room closures across the province, patients being de-rostered and 40% of family doctors considering retirement over the next five years, and;

WHEREAS it is becoming increasingly challenging to attract and retain an adequate healthcare workforce throughout the health sector across Ontario, and;

WHEREAS the Northern Ontario School of Medicine University says communities in northern Ontario are short more than 350 physicians, including more than 200 family doctors, and half of the physicians working in northern Ontario are expected to retire in the next five years, and;

WHEREAS Ontario municipal governments play an integral role in the health care system, through responsibilities in public health, long-term care and paramedicine, and;

WHEREAS the percentage of family physicians practicing comprehensive family medicine has declined from 77% in 2008 to 65% in 2022, and;

WHEREAS per capita health-care spending in Ontario is the lowest of all provinces in Canada, and;

WHEREAS a robust workforce, developed through a provincial sector-wide health human resources strategy, would significantly improve access to health services across the province;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT Council for the Municipality of Mattice – Val Côté urge the Province of Ontario to recognize the physician shortage in Mattice – Val Côté and in Ontario and to fund health care appropriately to ensure every Ontarian has access to physician care, and;

	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT a copy of this resolution be forwarded to AMO and OMA, to the Premier of Ontario, Doug Ford, to the Minister of Health and to our local parliament representatives, MPP Guy Bourgouin and MP Carol Hughes. Carried
Estimate - engineering fees	Resolution 24-159: Joyce Malenfant – Sophie Gagnon BE IT RESOLVED THAT Council hereby authorizes Randy Miller to prepare engineering plans for the replacement of the Val Côté bridge, for an estimated cost of SIX THOUSAND, FIVE HUNDRED (\$6,500) DOLLARS, plus taxes, and; BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT Council understands that additional fees may be incurred should soil component information need to be produced. New columbarium - fees	Resolution 24-160: Marc Dupuis – Sophie Gagnon WHEREAS a new 20 door columbarium was recently purchased and delivered for the St-François Xavier Cemetery, and; WHEREAS fees must now be established for the sale of the niches therein; NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the fees for the new 20 door columbarium be established as follows: TWO THOUSAND THREE HUNDRED (\$2,300) DOLLARS for niches in the top row; TWO THOUSAND TWENTY-FIVE (\$2,025) DOLLARS for niches in the second row; ONE THOUSAND SEVEN HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE (\$1,725) DOLLARS for niches in the third row; ONE THOUSAND FOUR HUNDRED AND FIFTY (\$1,450) DOLLARS for niches in the bottom row.
