Land Transfer Tax and GST

Resolution 24-223: Marc Dupuis – Joyce Malenfant

WHEREAS municipalities face growing infrastructure needs, including roads, bridges, public transit, water systems and other critical services, which are essential to community well-being and economic development, and;

WHEREAS the current sources of municipal revenue, including property taxes and user fees, are insufficient to meet these increasing demands for infrastructure investment, and;

WHEREAS the Province of Ontario currently collects the Land Transfer Tax (LTT) on property transactions in municipalities across the province, generating significant revenue that is not directly shared with municipalities, and;

WHEREAS the federal government collects the Goods and Services Tax (GST) on property transactions, a portion of which could be directed to municipalities to address local infrastructure needs, and;

WHEREAS redistributing a portion of the LTT and of the GST to municipalities would provide a predictable and sustainable source of funding for local infrastructure projects without creating a new tax burden on residents or homebuyers, and; WHEREAS this redistribution would allow municipalities to better plan and invest in long-term infrastructure initiatives, supporting local economic growth and improving the quality of life for residents.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT Council for the Municipality of Mattice – Val Côté hereby support Resolution no. 333/2024 made by the Township of McGarry requesting the provincial government to consider redistributing a portion of the Land Transfer Tax collected on property transactions to municipalities and calling upon the federal government to allocate a percentage of the Goods and Services Tax collected on property sales to municipalities, and;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT this redistribution of the LTT and GST should be structured to provide predictable and sustainable funding to municipalities, allowing for better long-term planning and investment in infrastructure projects that benefit local communities, thus ensuring that local

governments receive a fair share of the revenue to address critical infrastructure needs, and;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Township of McGarry, to Premier Doug Ford, to Prime Minister Justin Trudeau and to our local parliament representatives MPP Guy Bourgouin and MP Carol Hughes.

OPP services

Resolution 24-224: Joyce Malenfant – Réginald Manning WHEREAS the 2025 OPP annual billings represent significant increases for many Ontario municipalities, and;

WHEREAS the downloading of costs such as these from the province and the subsequent significant cost increases are not feasible or sustainable for small, rural municipalities in Ontario who are bound to raising their revenue solely through property taxes and user fees.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT Council for the Municipality of Mattice – Val Côté hereby support the Resolution made on November 4th 2024 by Council for the Township of Howick and the Resolution made on November 12th 2024 by Council for the Municipality of Leamington, immediately calling upon the Ontario Government to implement sustainable funding for small, rural municipalities by reabsorbing the cost of the Ontario Provincial Police Force back into the provincial budget with no cost recovery to municipalities or to at least reduce the increase to a more manageable one, in line with historical trends, and;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Township of Howick, to the Municipality of Learnington and to our local parliament representatives, MPP Guy Bourgouin and MP Carol Hughes.

Paramedics and EMS personnel

Resolution 24-225: Sophie Gagnon - Marc Dupuis

WHEREAS the rolling shortages of paramedics and EMS personnel in the region present a significant risk to public safety and healthcare services in northern communities, which are disproportionately affected by the province-wide shortage of paramedics, and;

WHEREAS recruitment and retention issues, including insufficient wages and benefits, lack of mental health supports, frequent exposure to traumatic experiences and inadequate recovery time between work periods are causing high turnover rates and burnout among EMS workers.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT Council for the Municipality of Mattice – Val Côté hereby support Resolution no. 266-2024 made by the Township of Terrace Bay, requesting that the Honourable Sylvia Jones, Minister of Health, take immediate action to address the funding shortfalls and structural challenges in the delivery of EMS services in northern communities, including: 1) increasing provincial funding to support EMS services and reduce the financial burden on municipalities; 2) implementing incentives such as "learn and stay" grants to encourage paramedics to live and work in northern Ontario and 3) enhancing support systems for EMS workers, including improved wages, benefits and mental health resources, and;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Township of Terrace Bay, to the Minister of Health and to our local parliament representatives, MPP Guy Bourgouin and MP Carol Hughes.

New Board of Health

Resolution 24-228: Steve Brousseau – Réginald Manning WHEREAS three current Directors of the Porcupine Health Unit Board of Health, representing the Township of Hornepayne, the Town of Hearst and the Municipalities of Mattice – Val Côté, Opasatika and Val Rita – Harty, are interested in representing the Rural North region on the new Board of Health for Northeastern Health Unit, which will come into effect on January 1st, 2025, and;

WHEREAS the name of the municipal appointee for the seven municipalities that form the Rural North seat must be provided to the Porcupine Health Unit by December 13th, 2024, and; WHEREAS it is up to the seven municipalities to work together to jointly appoint a member.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT Council for the Municipality of Mattice – Val Côté hereby support the appointment of Mayor Marc Dupuis as the Rural North representative on the New Board of Health, and;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT, in order to establish a fair and equitable process and to plan for the foreseeable future, the CAO communicate the following proposal to the other six municipalities:

a) the three municipalities that have demonstrated an interest in representing our region will occupy said position on the new Board of Health on an alternating basis over the course of the next ten years, to complete the current term (2025-2026) and for the following two terms (2026-2030, 2030-2034) and b) in 2034, a similar exercise will be conducted amongst the seven municipalities to assess interest and to assign representation, on an alternating basis, for upcoming terms.
